### **Lawrence Transit History and Vision**

- Boris Palchik and the City of Lawrence discuss the project catalyst.
  - o The main transfer hub has been located near the library since 2013.
  - A new transfer hub location has been identified. The new location currently has no transit activity.





- o The system will need to be restructured to serve the new location.
- Boris Palchik asks attendees about agency and community goals, and how a successful outcome will be defined.
  - o A. Rudisell Feels routes are efficient and limited transfers are needed.
  - o C. Bowen Do we reduce vehicle traffic with buses?
  - C. Bryan Notes that 65.7% of households are within a ½ mile of transit but that more households should have access to high frequency transit.
  - M.F. Isaacs Recommends looking into the <u>Community Health Plan to Reduce</u> <u>Poverty</u>
  - K.C. Ritchie Recommends looking into the <u>Food System Plan</u> at Objective 3.1 page 24.
- The group discusses service issues and unmet needs.
  - F. Gipp There is a big food access gap in East Lawrence. Also notes that safe routes for Haskell students should be considered.
  - o M. de Vries North, Pickney, and East Lawrence have food access issues.
  - o C. Bowen We may not be connecting people with destinations
  - M DeVries Access to elementary and middle schools is limited. The busing distance is 2.5 miles.
  - C. Tilden Many middle and high school students utilize the system to get to school. How do lower income neighborhoods access destinations?
  - A. Weigel Sunday service is always requested. We need to explore fare free service.
- The group discusses recent efforts.
  - A. Weigel They have tried flex service (a fixed-route that can flex into different areas) on Peterson Rd. The ridership was enough that it became a fixed-route.
  - M. de Vries The west edge of town is not served.
  - M. de Vries Nightline has been very successful. It first started as two vehicles.
     Vehicles have been added to meet the demand.
  - G. Doll Nightline wasn't badly impacted by COVID. It gets people to and from work.
  - A. Quis KU on Wheels and the City Bus system are funded differently. Can we consolidate efforts at all? During break time routes stop and this impacts people.
  - o M. de Vries The first Monday after classes end there are always a flurry of calls.

- Boris Palchik explains the Public Engagement Strategy
  - The strategy will include: An Online Public Transit Survey, Public Meetings, and Content for the Lawrence Project page (<a href="https://lawrencetransit.org/transfer-facility/">https://lawrencetransit.org/transfer-facility/</a>)
  - The group discussed the surveys.
    - o Could there be a non-online version of the survey?
    - Boris Palchik notes that if responses are not representative there can be follow-up in-person surveying as needed.
    - A. Weigel They have had success with on board surveys.
    - M. F. Isaacs Giving people an incentive would be good. Also, the library has become an informal survey collection center.
    - The My Bus Lawrence app should send push notifications.
    - o M. de Vries Surveys should be sent out before final exam week.
- The redesign approach will be data driven but informed by the public. The survey and automated passenger counter (APC) data will provide key insight.
